Wyo. Hiring freeze for state agencies goes into effect

CASPER (AP) — A hiring freeze has taken effect in Wyoming for all state agencies.

The Casper Star-Tribune reports the freeze has begun Monday.

The freeze affects all agencies except for the University of Wyoming and the Department of Corrections.

Wyoming Governor's spokesman David Bush says from July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2018, 319 positions have been lost from the executive branch of state government.

He says about 7,500 people currently work in executive branch agencies.

Wyoming Health Department Director Tom Forslund expressed his concern with the freeze to lawmakers. Forslund says any-

body who quits or retires cannot be replaced, and his staff is already feeling the pressure of not having enough workers.

in Laramie, has been coming to Rawlins for nearly 20 years after first making a trip to the U.S. in the '80s and continues to teach children how to care for one another.

"The Aboriginal people say you care for the land, as that is your primary responsibility. By caring for the land, which is your mother, you then learn to care for each other. In a fundamental survival, it basically means the way you can care for your family."

During Taylor's visit, the younger students will create several projects such as boomerangs. Students in third and fourth grades will paint a horse mural while the fifth graders spend time making didgeridoos. Placed in the elemen-

tary's art room, the mural already partially finished, pictured a river, a horse and mountain all flowing in together. Art Teacher Jamie Chapman said the middle school students helped prep the outlines for the elementary mural and get it started prior to Taylor's arrival.

"I invited the middle school kids to come up with ideas and they did them on little strips of paper," she said. "I did a conglomeration of everybody's ideas knowing that their mascot at the elementary is a mustang.'

The mural is expected to be displayed on May 11 in the hall and will be a permanent fixture.

Chapman said she was excited to see the kids at work "because I think it will help them remember what they have learned."

In addition to working with the elementary students nonstop over the next few weeks, Chapman said Taylor also plans to visit with middle school students as well as the Boys and Girls Club in order to continue reaching out to students.
